Topic: League of Women Voters - Ballot Issues

The September branch meeting will be held in conjunction with The Monterey County League of Women Voters and is open to the public. It will be a panel discussion of the pros and cons of selected initiatives on the November ballot. Light refreshments will be served.

The initiatives to be included are:

Proposition 57 - Criminal Sentences. Juvenile Criminal Proceedings and Sentencing - allows parole consideration for persons convicted of non-violent felonies upon completion of full prison term for primary offence.

Proposition 62 - Repeal of the Death Penalty.

Proposition 63 - Firearms. Ammunition Sales - prohibits possession of large-capacity ammunition magazines and terms of their disposal.

Proposition 64 - Marijuana Legalization - legalization of marijuana and hemp under state law.

Proposition 66 - Change of procedures governing state court appeals and petitions challenging death penalty convictions and sentences.

### Michael Sovereign

Mike grew up outside Chicago. He has a BS in chemical engineering from University of Illinois, a MS in industrial management and a PhD in economics from Purdue. He was Assistant Prof. of Business Admin. at U of I, then at the Office of the Secretary of Defense, then in the Operations Research dept., NPS, and interim director of the Navy Center for Acquisition Research. After becoming Professor and chairing the OR dept., he became assistant to the Comptroller of DoD, Pentagon. Back to NPS, he created and later chaired a new curriculum. He and Barb spent two years with NATO in the Hague and a year with the Commander, US Forces Pacific in Honolulu. In 1999, he retired. Now gardening, tennis, Friends of the Library, and work on the bicentennial of the Battle of Monterey fill his time.

August 6 was the 51st anniversary of the Voting Rights Act. The U.S. Court of Appeals for the 4th Circuit struck down a N. Carolina voter I.D. law on grounds that it disproportionately prevented black people from voting. Similar decisions were reached in Texas, Wisconsin, and N. Dakota. Clearly the intent of many new voter laws is to discriminate.

The U.S. sent the highest number of women athletes in Olympic history to participate in 2016 summer games. In London (2012), U. S. women won more than half of the total medals awarded and 60% of the gold medals.

A study of congress since 2009 shows women legislators passed twice as many bills as their male counterparts. They were also better at getting funds for their districts and more likely to introduce legislation focused on women.

Two foundations have donated \$2 million to Planned Parenthood to fund long acting reversible contraception for women in the Dallas-Ft. Worth Texas area.

August 25, California Senate acted on ACR 155, Campos, The Equal Pay Day Resolution. AAUW CA was a sponsor of the bill, as it was when the bill passed the Assembly in April.
