PUBLIC POLICY

AAUW joined 92 organizations signing a letter to Congress informing them we stand with PLANNED PARENTHOOD. We also oppose congressional plans to defund PLANNED PARENTHOOD and the women they serve. Let your representatives know your opinion.

The U.S. Senate Health, Education, Labor and Pension's committee held a hearing on campus sexual assault in advance of reauthorization of the Higher Education Act. The hearing focused on the importance of confidential advisors for victims, clearer and more effective relationships with local police while still protecting victims, and what the federal government can do to help campuses protect victims and achieve justice in sexual assault cases. I watched several hours of the hearings on CSPAN and it was interesting to see how many women senators were on the committee;
