



BOARD MEETINGS November 7 (no December meeting) 4:00 PM Monterey City Library	Cost of government shutdown was \$24 billion dollars according to Standard and Poor's. The money is all wasted because of political games. Unless lawmakers agree to funding levels the government will close again Jan. 15th. The Supreme Court will hear approximately 80 cases this year. There are to be cases touching on reproductive rights, racial discrimination, campaign finance, and state-sanctioned prayer. It may hear challenges to contraceptive insurance coverage. 	Some summary information about our Local Scholarship Program:
	 Since 1953, more than 125 scholarships have been given, totally at least \$82,635* Yearly tuition and fees at CSUMB rose 212% since 2001: 2001: \$1908 2005: \$3000 2009: \$4800 2013: \$5962 In the last 13 years, our awards covered between 20%-45% of CSU fees In 2001, our \$850 scholarship covered 45% of costs Our 2012 scholarship amount of \$1200 was covering 20%. In 2013, with our increase to \$1500, we covered 25% of yearly costs. If we raise enough funds to provide \$2000 scholarships this year, we will cover 33% of costs.
	* There are 15 years where records were lost (but some scholarships were likely given); there were 4 years where no scholarships were given.
