From Idea to Installation: The Museum Exhibition Process

Marcelle Polednik Chief Curator, Monterey Museum of Art

Enjoy an afternoon at La Mirada, Monterey Museum of Art (MMA), when Marcelle Polednik presents a slide-illustrated lecture and "behind the scenes" account of the creation of a museum exhibition. Before arriving at MMA, Dr. Polednik was an Assistant Curator at the Whitney Museum of American Art, where she assisted in the preparation of the first major retrospective of modernist Oscar Bluemner. Since her arrival at MMA in 2006 she has organized a variety of thematic and conceptual exhibitions focusing on modern and contemporary art, California modernism, and photography. Her efforts to mine the riches of the Museum's collection have culminated in significant rediscoveries and exhibitions, including *Henri Matisse: Jazz* and *Shifting Ground: Rediscovered Treasures of the Monterey Museum of Art*.

The program will be held in the lovely drawing room at La Mirada and followed by afternoon tea catered by Wild Plum. Bring a friend!

TAKE ACTION

California women have had to pay 39% more than men for health insurance even for policies that do not cover maternity care. A new law signed by Gov. Arnold Schwarznegger prohibits this practice of arbitrarily charging women more than men. Thousands of calls and letters advocating this bill were received by officials --and officials responded.

Meaningful health care reform must be equitable to all women. A house prepared Stupak amendment would go further than current Federal law which bans the use of Federal funds for abortions. It would prohibit women who receive Federal subsidies from choosing a comprehensive health insurance which provides such services. It would force private insurance companies to eliminate abortion coverage for all members and would effectively institute what amounts to a domestic gag rule. Millions of women, including those in private plans, would lose the coverage they currently have. Reform should not come at the cost of a woman's reproductive health.

The program will celebrate the 25th Anniversary of Women's History Month by presenting two dynamic speakers and honoring two of own for their contributions to AAUW and Local Scholarships. Ruth Coleman, Director of California State Parks, will give the Welcoming Address and discuss the role for volunteers in building and saving California State Parks. Sylvia Panetta, Director of the Panetta Institute and the Sylvia Panetta Scholarship Fund, has indicated that she very much wishes to participate in this event and has tentatively accepted our invitation, schedule permitting, and will confirm in the first part of 2010. Ms. Panetta will address Building Women Leaders through

Education. This program will also honor Betty Van Meter for her long dedication to and development of the AAUW Ruth Vreeland MPC Scholarships and the AAUW CSUMB Scholarships. Our Branch President, Sharyn Siebert, submitted the following article to the CA AAUW for the CA newsletter (you may learn something about your own branch).

Due to our branch's significant influence on our Monterey Peninsula service area, 50 years of our scrapbooks have been archived in the California Room of the Monterey Free Library, making them available for scholarly research.

Our branch general meetings regularly make use of the extensive resources in our area, hosting meetings featuring speakers such as: the Commander of the Presidio of Monterey/Defense Language Institute--Col. Sue Ann Sandusky; Belle Yang, a Carmel Valley author; and the former executive director of the National Steinbeck Center and son of a member, Steven Hoffman.

Two of our upcoming meetings have special significance for women. Womens' History Month will be cele-

brated by us on the grounds of Asilomar Conference Center, which was designed by Julia Morgan--the only woman architect with 2 buildings honored by registration on the National Register of Historic Resources. The talk is entitled "Building Women's Leadership through Education" and will feature Ruth Coleman, Director of California State Parks. For our upcoming May meeting, co-sponsored with Monterey Peninsula Newcomers club (formed by a former member), we are hosting Dr. Renee Snow, a member of the Santa Cruz branch and daughter of a longtime member, speaking on financial literacy for women. Her talk is entitled Money Matters: Protecting Yours in This Economy. Renee is both a PhD in Psychology, and is a Certified Financial Planner.

I hope some of this information can get disseminated to other California branches to show how vibrant our branch, founded in 1926, still is!
