# NATIONAL WOMEN'S HISTORY MONTH HONORING AAUW MONTEREY PENINSULA BRANCH

#### **ASILOMAR CONFERENCE GROUNDS**

#### MARCH 27, 2010

Members of The Monterey Peninsula Branch of the American Association of University Women will be honored guests at a National Women's History Month celebration in partnership with Asilomar State Park and Conference Center on March 27, 2010 at 10:30 AM in the Grace H. Dodge Chapel on the Asilomar Conference Grounds.

AAUW will address "Building the Future of Women through Education."

Featured speaker, Ruth Coleman, Director of California State Parks, will give the keynote address, "Building the Future for California State Parks".

Betty VanMeter and Mez Benton, long-time AAUW members and developers of local scholarship programs will be honored for their on-going contributions to women's education. In addition, some of our scholarship winners will be present and will be featured in the event program.

An optional luncheon (\$15) in the Seascape Room will follow the program. The event is free and open to the public.

Ruth Coleman was appointed Chief Deputy for California State Parks in January 2002, after serving as Deputy Director for Legislation. Previously, Ms. Coleman was Legislative Director for State Senator Mike Thompson, coordinating his legislative agenda and providing staff leadership on major environmental legislation such as a park bond, salmon and steelhead restoration, and the protection of the Headwaters Forest. Ms. Coleman received her Master in Public Administration from Harvard University, and a B.A. in Economics from Occidental College.
