The Paycheck Fairness Act (S182/HR12) is a much needed update of the 45 year old Equal Pay Act. It would close loopholes and strengthen means to prevent pay discrimination. Together with the Lily Ledbetter Fair Pay Act these bills can help to achieve a climate where wage discrimination is not tolerated and gives the administration the enforcement tools to make real progress to enforce pay equity. 


