SCHOLARSHIPS AWARDED

The AAUW Monterey Peninsula Branch awarded four \$1200 scholarships to local students. The scholarships will assist students who have completed at least half of their graduation requirements and show strong promise of graduating with an undergraduate degree. The committee received over 100 applicants for these awards and the selection process involved many hours of discussion.

Andrea Cortes and Diana Olivares received CSUMB scholarships. Ms. Cortes is a graduate of North Monterey County High School and is majoring in Liberal Studies. She intends to earn bilingual teaching credentials after graduation. Andrea currently volunteers as a California Mini-Corps instructional aide at the Los Padres Elementary School in Salinas. She writes to us, “Throughout my life, I have recognized the importance of education in the life of every woman. Your generosity is making a difference in my life as a student and as a woman. It is a great

honor for me to be considered by an organization like AAUW.”

Diana Olivares has an AA in Liberal Arts and Sciences and will graduate from CUSMB in 2010 with a degree in Social and Behavioral Sciences with a minor in Human Development. She volunteers with the P.U.P.I.L.S. program and tutors Pajaro High School students in English language development and written expression. For the past year she has worked as an intern with a local architecture firm, who gives her glowing recommendations. She writes, "I can't begin to express my gratitude for the opportunity you have given me with this scholarship. This scholarship will help to make my dream of going to a four year institution a reality.

Rick Barlow is a 4.0 GPA student continuing at UC Santa Cruz. He intends to pursue his passion to become a high school or college math teacher. Rick is a nontraditional student who spent seven years working for Starbucks, rising to the position of manager. He volunteers as a math tutor at MPC and in Marina High

School and both institutions consider him a dedicated and talented teacher in a difficult field. In his thank you letter, Rick writes, "My experience working in local high schools gave me the opportunity to observe the subtle disparity that still exists in education with respect to gender. As future educator, I look forward to creating solutions that address education inequalities that still exist for girls and in inspiring the next generation of scientists and leaders to go wherever their academic curiosity takes them, regardless of gender."
