Join us for a tour of the Presidio Museum and, weather permitting, the lower Presidio Historic Park. Access is easy; no ID required.

From Monterey: go to the northern end of Pacific Street (toward Pacific Grove) until you see the "do not enter" sign. Turn left onto Artillery Street, then turn right on Corporal Ewing Road. You will see the museum under the hill with the Sloat Monument.

From Pacific Grove: go south on Monterey's Lighthouse Avenue and turn right on Private Bolio Road. Go left on Corporal Ewing Road and past the Scout House to the museum. Do not go to the main gate.

No reservations are necessary and if you can't make it on the 20th, the museum is open Thursday - Saturday 10-4, Sunday 1-4 and Monday 10-1.
