Rosa is going to be a Surgeon. She worked in the fields with her parents until she was 12 years old. She credits her community for helping her get to college to pursue a Science degree. She wants to be a doctor because she witnessed firsthand in the fields of Greenfield the fear that the farm workers have of going to the hospital. They have no insurance or money to pay. She has interned at UCSC as a Research Volunteer and is a mentor to other young girls. Rosa will be participating in AAUW's Tech Trek program this summer!

Joanna - Hartnell

Joanna has had to work full time during the pandemic to support her family as her mother lost her job due to Covid. She still has managed to go to school full time and maintain an excellent GPA.
